

Vaccine Mandate for USask Rec programming.

As a reminder and in coordination <u>current Provincial Public Health Orders</u>, USask Rec requires that all patrons over the age of 12, provide proof of vaccination through <u>QR-code or approved</u> <u>documentation</u> upon entry to our Fit Centre and fitness classes. Patrons who are not fully vaccinated are required to provide either a negative test result from a <u>certified</u> COVID-19 polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test, a <u>certified</u> point-of-care antigen test or any COVID-19 test approved by the <u>Saskatchewan Health Authority</u> within the previous 72 hours.

USask Rec will be requiring all community members attending our facility and programs ages 12 and older to show proof of being fully vaccinated or a negative COVID-19 test as listed above, before participating in or spectating our recreation programs at the Physical Activity Complex and Education Building.

These measures aim to minimize the health risks to all when on USask campuses and participating in our recreation programming.

Indoor mask requirement extended for indoor and outdoor recreation on campus.

All USask Rec patrons are required to wear 3-ply single-use masks in all indoor and outdoor recreational spaces on USask campuses. This includes faculty, staff, students, visitors, spectators, and community members.

If you are entering the Physical Activity Complex or Education Building for recreation activity, you will be able to retrieve a 3-ply mask free of charge at the front desk. We ask that you please wear your own mask indoors until you can retrieve the provided 3-ply mask. Masks are required while participating in recreational programs at all outdoor locations on USask campuses.

For Campus Recreation, this means that effective immediately our patrons and our staff will be required to wear 3-ply masks while participating in Campus Recreation intramurals outdoors on the USask campus. We anticipate more than 20 student participants, substitutes, staff, officials, on-site supervisors, and spectators at games so this applies to our intramural programs, no exceptions.

Your compliance with this is appreciated and we hope you understand that by following this protocol not only are you protecting yourself and other, but also ensuring that our recreation programs continue to operate and provide opportunities to the USask community.
